

TinyPages — Acceptable Use Policy

Tiny Platforms Limited

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1. Purpose and Scope

TinyPages (“the Platform”), operated by Tiny Platforms Limited (“TinyPages”, “we”, “us”), is an all-in-one software platform that enables independent creators — coaches, trainers, therapists, consultants and course sellers (“Sellers”) — to build websites and sales pages, deliver online courses and digital products, run email marketing, and accept payments from their own customers.

Payments are processed through third-party payment providers, including Stripe Connect and PayPal Complete Payments for Platforms. Each Seller onboards and transacts through their own connected payment account; funds settle directly to the Seller.

This Acceptable Use Policy (“AUP”) sets out the products, services and activities that are prohibited or restricted on the Platform. It applies to every Seller and to all content, products, and transactions on TinyPages, and is incorporated into and forms part of the TinyPages Terms of Service. By using TinyPages, Sellers agree to comply with this AUP, with the acceptable use policies of our payment providers (including the PayPal Acceptable Use Policy), and with all applicable laws.

2. Prohibited Activities

Sellers may not use TinyPages, or any connected payment account accessed through TinyPages, to offer, sell, promote, or facilitate any of the following:

Illegal and regulated goods

- Narcotics, steroids, controlled substances, or any illegal drugs, drug paraphernalia, or substances designed to mimic illegal drugs
- Tobacco products, cigarettes, e-cigarettes, and vaping products
- Ammunition, firearms, firearm parts or accessories, explosives, or weapons and knives regulated under applicable law
- Any product, service, or activity that is illegal, or that encourages, promotes, facilitates, or instructs others to engage in illegal activity

Stolen, counterfeit, and infringing items

- Stolen goods, including digital and virtual goods
- Items or content that infringe or violate any copyright, trademark, right of publicity or privacy, trade secret, or other intellectual property or proprietary right
- Counterfeit or unauthorized goods, or unauthorized copies of copyrighted or trademarked material

Harmful and offensive content

- Content or items that promote, support, or glorify hatred, violence, racial or other forms of intolerance, or the financial exploitation of a crime
- Obscene material, and sexually oriented materials or services prohibited by applicable law
- Content that harasses, threatens, defames, or exploits any individual, or that involves minors in any inappropriate way

Fraudulent, deceptive, and financial schemes

- Pyramid schemes, Ponzi schemes, matrix programs, “get rich quick” schemes, or multi-level marketing programs
- Any product or service identified by government or regulatory agencies as having a high likelihood of being fraudulent or deceptive
- The disclosure or sale of any third party’s personal or financial information in violation of applicable law
- Sales of annuities, lottery contracts, lay-away systems, off-shore banking, or transactions to finance or refinance debt
- Money service activities: currency exchange, check cashing, wire transfers, traveler’s checks, money orders, or acting as an unlicensed money transmitter or payment aggregator collecting funds on behalf of others
- Credit repair, debt settlement, or debt collection services offered in violation of applicable law
- Bribery, corruption, money laundering, or terrorist financing

Sale before possession / undeliverable goods

- Sales of items or services the Seller does not have the right, ability, or intent to deliver
- Sales of items before the Seller has control or possession of them

3. Restricted Activities (Pre-Approval Required)

Certain activities are permitted only where the Seller holds all required licenses, complies with all applicable laws, and — where required — has obtained prior written approval from TinyPages and the relevant payment provider. These include:

- Gambling, gaming, sweepstakes, lotteries, or any activity with an entry fee and a prize, where permitted by law and properly licensed
- Sale of alcohol
- Sale of CBD, hemp-derived, or related products
- Prescription drugs, pharmaceuticals, medical devices, or online pharmacy services
- Financial and investment services, securities, cryptocurrency, or products offering financial returns
- Charitable fundraising and donations
- Travel services, timeshares, and travel clubs
- Regulated professional services (legal, medical, financial advice) requiring licensing in the Seller’s jurisdiction

TinyPages primarily supports the sale of lawful digital products and services — online courses, coaching and consulting programs, memberships, and digital downloads. Sellers offering anything in the categories above must contact us before doing so.

4. Seller Responsibilities

Each Seller is solely responsible for:

- Ensuring their products, content, and marketing comply with this AUP, all applicable laws, and the terms of their connected payment providers
- Holding all licenses, permits, and authorizations required for their business
- Accurately describing their products and delivering them to customers
- Handling their own customer support, refunds, disputes, chargebacks, and tax obligations

TinyPages is not a party to transactions between Sellers and their customers.

5. Enforcement

We reserve the right to determine, in our sole discretion, whether a product, content, or activity violates this AUP. Where we identify a violation, or are notified of one by a payment provider or authority, we may — without prior notice and without liability — remove content, disable a product's checkout, suspend or terminate the Seller's account, withhold or reverse transactions, and report the activity to the relevant payment provider or authorities. Terminations for violations are typically made without refund of subscription fees, and the Seller remains responsible for any resulting refunds, chargebacks, or losses.

This Acceptable Use Policy supplements, and does not replace, the acceptable use policies of our payment providers. In the event of a conflict regarding payments processed through a provider, that provider's acceptable use policy governs those transactions.
